The discussion was lead by a parenting expert as well as a school psychologist focused on immigrants and a therapist from a torture treatment program. While the parents had their seminar, the children worked with a drama therapist in an adjoining room. On another occasion, we put together an event for torture survivor children with a drama therapist working on the topic of coming to America. As we provide legal representation, we discover issues pertaining to families and children who are torture survivors and try to address them in a group setting, which has proven to be very successful.
